- Doing hemlock restoration on trout streams
- Helping in the SGH education station for a kids' event

- Distributing hemlock information in your school, church, or neighborhood
- Using your artistic talents to raise awareness
- Writing an article for your school newspaper
- Putting on the play "Once Upon a Hemlock"
