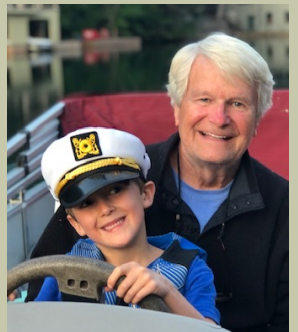


Donna Shearer, Founder
