2017 STRATEGIES & ACTIVITIES

- * **Progress report as of 4-8-17** Quarterly activity reports were turned in today, so it will take a day or so to summarize them, but here are the highlights known so far:
- All 19 HWA-infested Georgia counties in native hemlock range now served by our Hemlock Help Program
- Hemlock Help Line available 7 days a week with 435 calls handled
- 3 SGH Hemlock Help Clinics & Facilitator Training Workshops with 14 attendees 13 new Facilitators trained, 1 Facilitator refreshed. Current total of 220 Facilitators in Georgia and 55 in other states.
- 158 Facilitator visits made with charitable treatment of 1,101 trees
- 2 customized training classes for 12 civic/community volunteers
- 6 presentations to civic/community groups with 143 attendees
- 2 Hemlock Lessons for 130 elementary students
- 1 festival with 1 volunteer and 30 visitors/contacts
- 7 articles/news items written by, with the assistance of, or about SGH published in newspapers/magazines
- 9 hemlock rescue projects with 25 volunteers, 536 saplings / seedlings rescued and potted for future adoption
- 24 hemlock saplings adopted, 2 large saplings donated to municipalities / nonprofits
- 1 hemlock field insectary project with 26 volunteers planting 24 large saplings
- 2 other hemlock sapling planting projects with 4 volunteers planting 7 large saplings
- 13 hemlock treatment projects with 168 volunteers treating/retreating 1,361 trees
- 15 soil injectors repaired/refurbished
- Total of 1,929 volunteer hours logged to date
- * **Review of distributed operating model**, coordination, adjustments, info needed? All seems to be working well so far.
- * Education reports from group, calendar of upcoming classes
- All classes are scheduled, and space is reserved for all but the 6/10/17 class for Rabun & Towns; Donna will call the Rabun Library and John Scaduto of the Rabun Extension Office.
- Our participation in the April 21 Hemlock Lesson with seedling potting for elementary kids at High Meadows School Earth Day celebration is dependent on availability of seedlings; not looking promising at present.



- We've been requested to participate in Hamilton Gardens Earth Day celebration on April 22 in Hiawassee, but one of the two people who volunteered has canceled, so we likely will not do it this time.
- We've been requested to participate in Reece Farm Earth Day celebration on May 6 in Blairsville; Wynn Mott will staff our info table and give 15 minute presentation.
- Our participation in the May 12 Hemlock Lesson with seedling potting for elementary kids at Blackburn Elementary School Bear Jamboree is dependent on availability of seedlings; not looking promising at present.
- Buz will need saplings with skirts, cord, stakes, velcro tape, and care cards for the LRA Memorial Day meeting; Donna will provide these in advance.

* **Treatment** – reports from group

- SGH-USFS treatment project so far have been in the Chattooga River District.
- Frank will set up a meeting with Justin Seaborn and Adam Blair re beginning to support treatment projects in the USFS Conasauga District.
- Jim Reich and local volunteers have also been doing treatments on public lands along the Upper Toccoa River, and Ray Lorenzi and local volunteers have been doing treatment in Bent Tree, Pickens County.
- It was suggested that we contact Chuck Stutzman of the Boy Scouts for young volunteers in the Rabun County area and someone with the FFA program for young volunteers in the Gilmer County area. Bob to contact Chuck; Darrell to contact FFA.
- For April 15 treatment project in Rabun Recreation area, the following will be needed in addition to what Bob already has on hand: 4 injectors, 4 work kits, 4 sets of jugs, snacks Donna will bring.
- It was suggested that we contact Girl Scout camps and Hambidge Center to see if they want/need a hemlock treatment project, but no decision was taken as to who should make the contacts.
- * Saplings reports from group
- Potted saplings will be needed for upcoming events UNG's Earth Day Celebration on April 17, Bear on the Square on April 22, Trout Fest on April 29, Reece Farm Earth Day Celebration on May 6, and Blue Ridge Arts Festival on May 27.
- Chris will contact Deb Gable near Goose Island for permission to rescue saplings; also to contact Loretta Hanks re harvesting Carolina seed cones later this summer; also to contact Jim Hamby and Kathy Overstreet who have offered saplings.
- Frank and Kim indicated they have saplings they are rescuing and potting.
- Status of USFS sapling digging permit They sent us a set of very time-consuming requirements to apply for the permit. Group consensus was that we would be better served by taking advantage of other sources of seedlings and saplings.
- We need to locate one or more sites for hemlock restoration on trout streams in Murray or Whitfield County to utilize the North Georgia EMC grant.

2017 FINANCIAL MATTERS

* **Income & expense report** as of 4/8/17 – The current report was presented and reviewed.

- * **Report on annual membership appeal** as of 4/7/17 To date we have received 78 new or renewing memberships totaling \$7,930.00.
- * Revised budget A revised budget was presented with adjustments for increased donations and decreased expenses.

- * **Grant funds request** for UGA *Rosellinia* needle blight project The group briefly discussed whether or not to send funds to this project and decided not to do so since the problem doesn't seem to be very severe now and the R.O.I. would be hard to quantify.
- * **Hemlock Cost Share Program** The concept document for a Rabun pilot was briefly discussed, and the group consensus was that it is not a good use of our resources, particularly considering the amount of logistics and record-keeping that would be required. Since we already have a process for providing charitable help when it's needed, another similar program is not needed.
- * Annual tax filing was presented to the group for review and was approved.
