

Purchasing Hemlocks

Please ...

- **Don't** dig hemlocks from public areas such as national forests or state parks.
- **Don't** bring hemlocks from areas that may be infested with adelgids to your own property.
- **Do** purchase hemlocks from reputable growers or retailers who can verify that they are not infested with adelgids or have already been treated.
- **Do** watch over your new hemlocks for signs of adelgids. If you detect an infestation, call the Hemlock Help Line 706-429-8010 and plan to take immediate action to deal with the problem.

Sources for Purchasing Hemlocks

Save Georgia's Hemlocks does not *sell* its trees, but we offer them for *adoption* for a suggested voluntary donation. You can contact us by phone at 706-429-8010.

We usually have the following on hand, and most will be locally grown:

- Hemlock seedlings 12 – 24 inches tall in 1-gallon pots for a suggested donation of \$10.
- Hemlock saplings 2 – 3 feet tall in 3-gallon pots for a suggested donation of \$25.
- Hemlock saplings 3 – 5 feet tall in 5- to 7-gallon pots for a suggestion donation of \$40.
- Larger hemlocks may be available with the suggested donation based on plant size.

If you purchase hemlocks from SGH, part or all of your donation will be tax-deductible.
