Hemlocks ranging from Maine to Alabama are in danger of almost total extinction due to a rapidly spreading infestation of the hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA), an invasive insect from Asia with no local natural predator. Hemlock stands are of vital importance to wildlife, water and air quality, local economy, and basic quality of life, and their loss would create problems of enormous scope and dire consequences.

Private property owners have the option to save as many hemlocks as they desire, and the good news is that it's easy and inexpensive to do. SAVE GEORGIA'S HEMLOCKS has implemented Hemlock Help for Homeowners, a nonprofit program of education and charitable service, to raise awareness, promote action, and provide practical assistance to homeowners in north Georgia.
