# Helton Creek Falls Hemlock Treatment – November 10 Joint Project of Save Georgia's Hemlocks & U. S. Forest Service

**EVENT**: Includes a family-friendly trail hike (only about ½ mile), volunteer hemlock treatment service

project, picnic beside Helton Creek Falls

**PURPOSE**: To help the U. S. Forest Service treat hemlocks in the conservation area and have a good time

together in the great outdoors.

**WHERE**: Meet at the parking lot on Helton Creek Rd. See maps and driving directions on next page.

WHO CAN

**PARTICIPATE:** Facilitators and newbies alike are encouraged to participate. If you're new to the treatment process,

we'll teach you what you need to know, and you'll work in a team with some experienced Facilitators.

All work will be done under the supervision of the Forest Service and SGH.

**SCHEDULE:** Be at the parking lot at 10 a.m. sharp. After a brief orientation, we'll hike to the work site and

begin treating tagged hemlocks in the conservation area with Imidacloprid by soil injection. This

is a re-treatment project as the trees were originally treated 5-6 years ago.

We'll break at mid-day for a picnic lunch, and then continue work until we finish or 3 p.m.,

whichever comes first. Anyone who needs to leave early can do so.

#### WHAT TO WEAR -- REQUIRED

Dress for the weather – it may be cool.

Long pants

Long sleeved shirt

Sturdy shoes/boots with socks

Good work gloves

### WHAT TO BRING

A sack lunch and personal water bottle

Camera and cell phone if you like

Rain gear in case of light rain

A lightweight back pack might be good too.

#### WHAT NOT TO BRING

This is an environmentally-friendly, pack-it-in pack-it-out event, so please don't bring any glass or styrofoam items. Also, as much as we love dogs, please don't bring them this time.

## WHAT USFS AND SGH WILL PROVIDE

Soil injectors and chemicals

Mixing containers and gallons of warm water

Pocket instruction cards

Work aprons

Hard hats (required)

Extra measuring tapes, calculators, notepads, pens

Nitrile gloves to go under your work gloves

First aid kit and spill kit

#### **DRIVING DIRECTIONS**

Helton Creek Falls is on Helton Creek Rd, which runs between Hwy 129 and Hwy 348 (Richard Russell Hwy) in Union County just south of Vogel State Park.

From Blairsville - Take Hwy 129/19 south and go 11.3 miles. Turn left onto Helton Creek Rd.

<u>From Blue Ridge</u> – Take Hwy 76/515 east (Appalachian Highway) and go 23 miles. Turn right onto Hwy 129/19 and go south 11.5 miles. Turn left onto Helton Creek Rd.

From Ellijay – Take Hwy 515 north and go 36 miles to Blue Ridge. Then follow the Blue Ridge directions above.

<u>From Dahlonega</u> – Take Hwy 19 north and go 7.3 miles. At the Stone Pile, turn right to stay on Hwy 19 north and go 5 miles to Turners Corner. Turn left onto Hwy 129/19 north and go 9.3 miles. Turn right onto Helton Creek Rd.
