Where to Meet: Foxfire is located at The Foxfire Museum, Mountain City, GA 30562. We'll meet at the Visitor Center.

Schedule: 9:00 a.m. – All volunteers report. Following a briefing on the plan for the day, a demo and instructions

for how to treat the trees, and safety reminders. you'll be organized into small teams including at least one experienced SGH Facilitator per team and receive your equipment and supplies. Then you'll walk a

short distance to your work site and begin treating.

12:30 p.m. – Everyone will come together for lunch. After lunch, we'll resume work.

3:00 p.m. or sooner – We'll stop work, clean up, and head for home.

Access: Access to Foxfire is via paved roads with a short distance on gravel road to the Visitor Center.

Four-wheel drive is not necessary.

Terrain: The terrain at the treatment sites is flat to gently rolling. We'll make sure everyone is assigned to a site

where they can be safe and comfortable.

What to Wear: Dress for the weather and the activity, including long pants and long sleeves, work gloves, sturdy

footgear with socks, and rain gear in case of light rain.

What to Bring: Save Georgia's Hemlocks will be providing our lunch, but if you have food allergies or special dietary

requirements, please feel free to bring your own lunch.

If you have any serious allergies (like bee stings), bring whatever you need to manage.

SGH will provide all the necessary tools and supplies.

Don't Bring: This is an environmentally-friendly, pack-it-in pack-it-out event, so please don't bring any glass or

styrofoam items. Also, as much as we love dogs, please don't bring them.
