Date	Sunday March 26, 2023		
Event	Service event to treat or retreat the hemlocks in <b>Tate Branch Campground</b> in <b>Towns</b> County. According to prior treatment logs, we expect to treat or retreat <b>280</b> trees.

Where to Meet	Tate Branch Campground – Chattahoochee National Forest. 4049 Tallulah River Rd. (becomes Forest Service Rd FS 70), Clayton, Ga 30525. Google Maps very accurate. See driving directions and map following. Directional signs will be posted. This area is north of Lake Burton. The Tallulah River flows into Lake Burton.		
Schedule	<b>9:00 a.m.</b> – All SGH volunteers meet. First, you'll receive a briefing on the condition of the hemlocks, treatment process to be used, and safety reminders. You'll be organized into small teams including at least one experienced SGH Facilitator per team and receive your equipment and supplies. Then you'll be directed to your work site and begin treating trees		
	12:30 p.m. – Everyone will break for lunch. After lunch, we'll resume work.		
	By 3:00 p.m. (probably sooner) – We'll stop work, clean the equipment, and head for home.		
Access	Access to the treatment site is easy via Tallulah River Rd (FS Rd 70). The road will go from paved to gravel (with some potholes). Four-wheel drive is not necessary. Parking will be in the campground area or at entrance depending on FS opening campground for the season.		
Terrain	The terrain at the work sites is flat other than some uphill areas along the road. We'll make sure everyone is assigned to a work site or job assignment where they can be safe and comfortable.		
What to Wear	Dress for the weather and the activity, including long pants and long sleeves, gloves and sturdy footgear, and rain gear in case of light rain. Nitrile gloves will be provided for those who will be handling chemicals.		
What to Bring	Pack a personal water bottle, sack lunch, and camera if you like. A hiking stick and small day pack to carry things might also come in handy. We'll provide extra bottled water and snacks. If you have any serious allergies (like bee stings), bring whatever you need to manage.		
Don't Bring:	This is an environmentally friendly, pack-it-in pack-it-out event, so please don't bring any glass or Styrofoam items. Also, as much as we love dogs, please don't bring them.
