The Nature Conservancy and Save Georgia's Hemlocks will be treating Hemlocks at the Holly Creek Preserve on November 4, 2017. This treatment will protect Hemlocks against the Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, an invasive insect that is killing Hemlocks across the Eastern U.S. The purpose of this project is to treat the Hemlocks that have been infected by the Adelgid and allow them to thrive for years to come.
